





WHAT DO WE KNOW HISTORICALLY ABOUT THE HUMAN LIONARDO AND THE MONA LISA?



The cover page and historical facts about Lionardo da Vinci, from the book of probably the only historian during the Renaissance, Giorgio Vasari, in 1550 and 1568, is the most important historical source about the Renaissance and calls Lionardo by the name he was then known, Lionardo and not Leonardo.

Vasari is also our only source for the title of the "Mona Lisa" and the fact that it was ordered by Francesco del Giocondo, for the portrait of his wife Mona Lisa. Later on historians found that her name was Lisa Gherardini.

However, also historically, Lionardo never delivered the masterpiece of Mona Lisa and kept it beside him until just before the end of his life, to give it, along with other paintings, to his student and model of almost 30 years, Salai. In his will he called Salai his 'servant', and from this kind of contrast you always have something new to learn.

Lionardo's beard appears in Vasari, in his self-portrait during his last years and in the profile by Francesco, as well as in the description by the Florentian historian Anonimo Gaddiano in 1540. These are all of the descriptions of Lionardo. The same historians describe Lionardo as a man of exceptional beauty who left no woman or man unmoved. A Seeker of Truth will then reasonably ask why beautiful Lionardo hid his handsome face as a young man, in the midst of an era and its painters that glorified beauty.


Regarding Lionardo's love life the only historic clue we have is that he was accused of sodomy, along with a few other young Florentines. Lionardo then asked for a favor from the head of the unions, writing:

Historians believe that Mona Lisa is Lisa Gherardini. Some that it is Lionardo and some that it is Salai. None of them are right and one of them is out of the question.




Young John the Baptist by Lionardo da Vinci, with Salai as the model
